Inside the venue, the sight of massive steel orchestras, sometimes comprising over a hundred musicians, is remarkable. The communal experience is heightened by the audience's reactions-cheers, dancing and collective appreciation for the skill and passion displayed. Attending Panorama offers a profound connection to Trinidad's musical heritage, leaving an indelible mark on all who witness it.
